

Signing ceremony of Japanese-Funded project “The Project for Improvement of the Educational Environment at Govera Primary School in Goromonzi District”

On March 9, 2017, Mr Dabide Tsunakake, Deputy Head of Mission, Embassy of Japan, signed a grant contract amounting to eighty-three thousand, one hundred and twenty-five dollars (USD 83,125) with a local NGO, Nhaka Foundation, for the Project for Improvement of the Educational Environment at Govera Primary School in Goromonzi District.

The project includes the construction of two new classroom blocks, the completion of another classroom block, and the renovation of an existing classroom block as well as provision of furniture. Currently, the students at the school are learning in dilapidated and unsafe buildings. Through the project, the school will have four completed and furnished classroom blocks. The students will thus be able to learn in a much more suitable environment. Mr Tsunakake highlighted that a safe learning environment was a basic necessity for children.
