

Signing ceremony of Japanese-Funded project “The Project for Improvement of the Educational Environment at Chishuku Secondary School in Chirumanzu District”

On March 9, 2017, Mr Dabide Tsunakake, Deputy Head of Mission, Embassy of Japan, signed a grant contract amounting to eighty-three thousand dollars (USD 83,000) with a local NGO, Local Initiative and Development (LID) Agency for the Project for Improvement of the Educational Environment at Chishuku Secondary School in Chirumanzu District.

The project includes the construction of one classroom block and the completion of three other classroom blocks, together with the furnishing of these classroom blocks. In addition to that, the completion of two ablution blocks and the construction of two teacher houses, as well as the drilling of a borehole will be implemented. The students will thus be able to learn in a much more suitable environment. Currently, the school does not have any classrooms of its own, and are borrowing the classrooms as well as horse stable from the neighboring primary school for their lessons. Hence, the pupils of the primary school are being forced to conduct their lessons outside under the tree. On completion of this project, the students of both primary and secondary schools will have an improved learning environment.
