Handover Ceremony of Counselling and Education Centre to Solve the Problems of Violence against Women and Girls in Murehwa District

On 2nd April, 2019, Ambassador Iwado officially opened a new Counselling and Education

Centre to stop abuse against women and girls in Murehwa District, Mashonaland East Province.

The new Centre was completed through Japan's Grant Assistance for Grassroots Human

Security Projects (GGP) scheme, and was implemented by a local NGO, Rozaria Memorial

Trust. It consists of a shelter, training block, counselling block, ablution block and furniture.

Previously, Rozaria Memorial Trust did not have sufficient space to conduct their activities to

counsel, educate and protect women in Murehwa who suffered from violence. With the new

furnished counselling and education centre right in the heart of the community, Rozaria

Memorial Trust is now able to provide education, counselling and shelter to a much larger

extent.

Speaking at the occasion, Ambassador Iwado said that violence against women and girls still

exists in Zimbabwe, whether inside or outside the home. He emphasised that everyone needs

to stand up and change attitudes so that this is no longer tolerated.

We look forward to many generations of women and girls benefitting from the new Centre,

and to a more inclusive society without any violence against women and girls in Murehwa and

beyond.
