

Handover ceremony of Japanese-Funded project “The Project for Improvement for the Educational Environment at Maizelands Secondary School in Bindura District”

Maizelands Secondary School in Bindura District now has a greatly improved educational environment thanks to funding from Japan. On 14 November, Ambassador Iwado attended the handover ceremony of newly completed facilities, including two furnished classroom blocks and a teacher’s house. These were completed through a project implemented by a local NGO, SOS Children’s Villages Zimbabwe.

Previously, the students and teachers at the school were lacking basic facilities, and they had to conduct their lessons in an old barn or under a tree without adequate desks and chairs.

Speaking at the handover ceremony, Ambassador Iwado asked the boys and girls to take advantage of the improved facilities and study hard. Then, he said, they would be able to realise their potentials and develop their talents, helping Bindura and Zimbabwe to become stronger and better.
